letter to the editor

This year, as for several years previ-ous, I attended the Good Friday Walk of Witness in a nearby town. Until this year, it was a silent procession observing Stations of the Cross along the route and ending with a Good Friday service in a pedestrian precinct in the town centre.

This year, with new organisers, the procession was full of chat and laughter, no Stations of the Cross were observed and the service covered the whole Easter

I have taken a long time to consider this matter and deciding how to react to it. I have decided to express my feelings in *Pompey Chimes* and am very interested to know how other people feel.

I do not approve of the new format and, at the end of the service, spoke to both the vicar in charge and one of the organisers about it. I was astonished to be told that Jesus was 'joyful' on the Cross and they wished to reflect this. Joyful??? "Father forgive them, they know not what they do" and 'Not my will but Thine" do not sound like the words of a joyful man.

Also, during the procession and service, flyers were handed out to the general public. I take issue with several points on the flyer, the main two of which I highlight below:

1. "Many Christians believe that human wrong-doing make it impossible to be with God". Don't all Christians believe this? Can one be a Christian if they don't believe this? Repentance, of course, can change this situation but this is only touched on much later in the text.
2. "Then Jesus is believed to have

risen..." Isn't it a <u>fact</u> that this hap-pened? Isn't this a foundation stone of Christianity?

If this new format is continued in coming years, I, and several other regulars, will not be taking part. I agree with spreading the Good News to others but it must express basic Christian beliefs and

be accurate and appropriate.

As a footnote, I attended the Passion Play in Havant recently and was delighted and relieved that it portrayed an anguished and distraught Jesus on the Cross. The entire play was extremely well done and all concerned are to be congratulated.
