"Polly and I had children in the choir and volunteered to do some arranging," said Andria. "She helped us to get started and encouraged us. So when my mother died last September I felt confident enough to arrange the flowers myself.

"Olive also rang me several times to check I was OK. She was so caring. She works selflessly on behalf of Holy Trinity."

Why does she do it? Olive has led the 17-strong team of flower arrangers for four years, ensuring beautiful displays in the sanctuary each week.

"The rota means the flowers change each two weeks, as we realised arrangements were still OK after a week. That means everyone in the team does it twice a year. And for the flower festival at the end of May, we open it up to other organisations in the village, and the place is full of flowers.

"It is also part of my worship in the church, especially at festival times, when we want the church

to look good for Christmas, Easter and so on.

"We don't do funeral flowers, but those who have been bereaved often call us about the arrangements, and we often end up having a chat. I used to work for a charity that helped people who were losing their sight, so I am used to helping people adjust to the next stage of their lives."
