The Liturgy of the Word

First Reading

A reading from the Second Letter to Timothy.

But as for you, continue in what you have learned and firmly believed, knowing from whom you learned it, and how from childhood you have known the sacred writings that are able to instruct you for salvation through faith in Christ Jesus. All scripture is inspired by God and is useful for teaching, for reproof, for correction, and for training in righteousness, so that everyone who belongs to God may be proficient, equipped for every good work. In the presence of God and of Christ Jesus, who is to judge the living and the dead, and in view of his appearing and his kingdom, I solemnly urge you: proclaim the message; be persistent whether the time is favourable or unfavourable; convince, rebuke, and encourage, with the utmost patience in teaching.

For the time is coming when people will not put up with sound doctrine, but having itching ears, they will accumulate for themselves teachers to suit their own desires, and will turn away from listening to the truth and wander away to myths. As for you, always be sober, endure suffering, do the work of an evangelist, carry out your ministry fully.

The Presentation of the Candidates for Admission

The candidates for admission are presented to the Bishop by the Head of Mission, Discipleship and Mission, the Revd Canon Dr Anthony Rustell

> Amanda Hollingsworth to be admitted to the office of Reader in Portsea, St Mary;
> Coleen Jackson to be admitted to the office of Reader in Blendworth with Chalton with Idsworth;
> Susan Moss to be admitted to the office of Reader in South Hayling, North Hayling and Eastoke;
> Elizabeth Quinn to be admitted to the office of Reader in Soberton, Newtown and Hambledon;
> Clare Watson to be admitted to the office of Reader in Alverstoke, St Mary, St Faith and St Francis.

The Declarations

The candidates for admission and licensing as Readers make the Declarations in the form prescribed by Canons E 5 and E 6.

The Warden of Readers reads the Preface to the Declaration of Assent.

The Church of England is part of the One, Holy, Catholic, and Apostolic Church, worshipping the one true God, Father, Son, and Holy Spirit. It professes the faith uniquely revealed in the Holy Scriptures and set forth in the catholic creeds, which faith the Church is called upon to proclaim afresh in each generation. Led by the Holy Spirit, it has borne witness to Christian truth in its historic formularies, the Thirty-nine Articles of Religion, the Book of Common Prayer and the Ordering of Bishops, Priests and Deacons. In the declaration you are about to make, will you affirm your loyalty to this inheritance of faith as your inspiration and guidance under God in bringing the grace and truth of Christ to this generation and making him known to those in your care?

Candidates I, A B, do so affirm, and accordingly declare my belief in the faith which is revealed in the Holy Scriptures and set forth in the catholic creeds and to which the historic formularies of the Church of England bear witness; and in public prayer, I will use only the forms of service which are authorized or allowed by Canon.

I, A B, will give due obedience to the Bishop of Portsmouth and his successors in all things lawful and honest.

I, A B, about to be licensed to exercise the office of Reader in the Diocese of Portsmouth, do hereby promise to endeavour, as far as in me lies, to promote peace and unity, and to conduct myself as becomes a worker for Christ, for the good of his Church, and for the spiritual welfare of all people. I will give due obedience to the minister in whose cure I may serve, in all things lawful and honest.

The Bishop asks these questions to which the Director of Portsmouth Pathway responds.

Bishop Are these candidates of Christian character, well versed in the Holy Scriptures and in the doctrines of our faith?

Bishop Have they been sufficiently prepared for the duties of this office?
