New £5m school on way

WORK on a new £5 million church primary school in West Wight has now started.

The new school will provide modern educational facilities on the site of the former All Saints C of E Primary School, in Freshwater. The development will provide a new home for Yarmouth Primary School and Little Stars Preschool, with capacity for around 210 pupils.

The project is being jointly funded by the Isle of Wight Council and the Department for Education (DfE). The estimated completion date is early 2023 with staff and pupils moving to the new site later that year.



Church's new service

AN Isle of Wight church started a new 'Sunday Brunch' service as their response to our Live | Pray | Serve vision. The new-style service was launched in October at St John's Church, Wroxall, and will be at 10am on the first Sunday of each month.

It attracted more people than a normal all-age service, and people also attended from St George's, Arreton, and All Saints, Newchurch. The theme was 'bread', reflecting on Communion, and the craft activity was making autumn wreaths.



Advent windows lit up

WORSHIPPERS at St John's Church, Locks Heath, will light up their windows with displays during Advent to help tell the Nativity story.

A total of 25 homes will create illuminated window displays that can be seen from the street - one for each day in December up to Christmas.
