BISHOP Jonathan has appointed Canon Kathryn Percival to be the new Archdeacon of the Meon. Kathryn, who is currently Canon Chancellor and Vice Dean of Portsmouth Cathedral, will serve the ministry of parishes in the Bishop's Waltham, Gosport, Fareham and Petersfield deaneries.

Canon Will Hughes, vicar of Petersfield and Buriton, will return to parish ministry after being acting Archdeacon of the Meon for two years.

Kathryn is married to James, a Royal Navy chaplain. She originally trained to be a barrister and worked in civil litigation, putting her career on hold to have children.
