THE new clergy team to serve in Ryde was completed as the Revs Heath Monaghan and Olly Mitchelmore were licensed by Bishop Jonathan.

The service took place in All Saints Church, Ryde, with worship led by Harbour Church intern Will Packham and a sermon by the bishop.

Heath and Olly will be working in a team with the Rev David Morgan across All Saints, St John's and St Michael's Churches in Ryde, as well as St Peter's, Havenstreet, and Holy Cross, Binstead. Their ambitious plans include a new contemporary congregation at All Saints, plus Cafe Church, traditional Eucharist and a network of interns.



## Centenary celebrations

A lottery grant of £9,995 allowed them to buy an InfoPoint device, which means they can abolish printed tourist guides and update material with ease.
