

Island school stays open

AN independent government adjudicator overturned a decision to close Arreton St George's CofE Primary School on the Isle of Wight. The Office of the Schools Adjudicator (OSA) ruled that the closure process followed by the council was flawed – there was no clear and transparent way of identifying which island schools should close.

It said the council offered misleading and incorrect information, and those procedural flaws are likely to have made a difference to the outcome. It therefore ruled that the school should remain open, in a vindication of the stance taken by the diocese.
