We appreciate your Concern and Love for the Environment and the care for God's beautiful creation. Your kind donation will help us among other things to:

- protect the Atewa Range Forest Reserve which is a habitat for many endemic and vulnerable biodiversity species; both flora and fauna and supplies water to over 5 million people in Ghana.
- secure the only known location serving as habitat for the iconic vulnerable Picathartes colonies in the Nyamebe Bepo Forest Reserve in Ghana.
- protect pangolins (the most trafficked animal) through our rescue and release-back to nature program thereby restoring their numbers.
- securing and protecting the habitat of the *limbochromis robertsi* (fish), a species of cichlid endemic to Ghana and found in few locations including the Red and White Krensen Streams near Akwadum and the streams in the Atewa Range Forest, both locations in the Atewa landscape.
