What is Fostering?

Fostering is:



Caring for someone else's child in your own home



Providing an opportunity for a child or young person to achieve the best possible outcomes

A foster placement provides the stability that is required for children and young people to develop and be looked after in a safe and secure environment.

Fostering within a family is often the best way for children and young people to feel protected, supported and start to gain a sense of their self-worth, and contribute to society.

Children come into care from a variety of backgrounds and for a variety of reasons. It is, therefore, necessary to have foster carers that mirror this diversity and are understanding, empathetic and supportive of all their differing needs.


Does This Sound Like You?

Our Foster Carers come from all walks of life; different ethnic backgrounds, cultures, lifestyles, ages and occupations. They are single, married, couples, divorced, widowed and with or without children of their own.

They are as varied as the children they care for, so a range of different Foster Carers is needed to meet the individual needs and personalities of these children.

No formal qualifications are necessary to start your career as a fostering professional but ideally, you will have some experience of caring for, or working with, children or young people.

Lots of our current Foster Carers found they had many transferable skills from their previous job roles that are now invaluable to them in their career as a Foster Carer.



You Can Foster

If you have:

- The time and energy to commit to helping a child or young person 🔆
 - A real interest in caring for a child's day to day needs 🔆
 - Patience, kindness and self-awareness
 - An understanding and sensitivity for children's emotional needs
 - At least one spare bedroom (owned or rented)
 - Ideally, have experience of working with children or parenting
 - Resilience and have a good sense of humour
 - A commitment to training to build your skills and confidence
- Passion about making a difference to children and young people lives

Types Of Fostering

A variety of fostering arrangements are available to provide the stability and security each child needs.



Your Role As A Foster Carer

Every child is different, but they all need care, support and encouragement.

These are some of the responsibilities that you will be expected to fulfil as a Foster Carer:

Provide a warm and safe family environment in your home

Promote attendance at school and encourage achievement

Be consistent and fair so that you build trust and mutual respect

Encourage contact with the birth families (where permitted)

Attend training and support groups to develop your career and foster skills

Meet regularly with your Social Worker to further enhance your skills as a Foster Carer

Provide accurate written records of your foster child's life and share relevant information

Give the child the opportunity to develop outside interests or hobbies

Support and prepare them to transition from care (either back to their birth parents or independent living)

The Assessment Process

The assessment process usually takes between 3 to 5 months. This is not an "academic test" but an important and necessary process to determine your suitability to look after vulnerable children and young people. We will support and guide you through every step of the assessment process.

It helps establish the type of foster child best suited to you and your family.

Fostering will affect your family and friends so this process helps prepare you for the challenges and rewards that fostering brings.

What Sets Fair Ways Apart?

Pay and allowances

Fair Ways recognises the challenges of fostering and the vital role our carers play in helping children and young people re-start their lives.

We regard fostering as a profession and we value our carers and treat them as professionals.

We pay carer allowances that reflect the age and complexity of the child's needs, together with the training and professional skills of the carer.

This allowance covers the cost of looking after the child or children and is recognition of our Foster Carers valuable skills as a professional carer.

Fair Ways seeks to ensure their carers will be the best rewarded both financially and emotionally.

FURTHER GENEROUS ALLOWANCES ARE PROVIDED FOR BIRTHDAYS AND FESTIVE CELEBRATIONS

Typical examples of pay* are:

£400 PER

A first time carer that has completed their induction, with no experience, may receive in excess of £400 for each child placed per week

£525 PER WEEK

A level 3 carer with a child aged 11+ receives in excess of £525 per

£650 PER WEEK

A specialist carer receives in excess of £650 per week for each child in placement



Case Studies

Specialist Fostering:

Desmond (13) had 17 previous placements which had all failed and was described by many as 'un-fosterable'. He was placed with Fair Ways Foster carers as an alternative to residential.

Desmond required experienced carers and a large support network but is now described as; "in a stable placement" and contributes positively in both school and the local community.

Unaccompanied Asylum Seeker:

Assefa was 16 when he arrived unaccompanied in this country from Eretria. He had fled his country through fear of persecution.

Assefa was taken into the care of the local authority and then placed with Fair Ways Eritrean Foster Carers who also had another child who has previously been an unaccompanied asylum seeker in their care.

Assefa needed therapeutic support to deal with his traumas and this support was put in place by Fair Ways and his Foster Carers

Assefa has been in the placement for a while and has thrived, including excelling at school. His proud Foster Carers want him to remain with them after he is 18.

Frequently Asked Questions

Will I need to give up work?

Fair Ways believes that the best care for a placed child is achieved by having one carer at home full-time. However, there may be circumstances where you are able to continue working, this will depend on your individual and family situation.

Do I need child care experience?

No, not necessarily. Ideally, you will have some experience of caring for children or parenting. Our training will develop your skills and abilities, and we will support you every step of the way.

Will fostering affect my family?

Without a doubt. Your family will all have different views so it is important that they are listened to and their feelings and circumstances carefully considered.

However, they will benefit by getting to know children from different backgrounds and appreciate the advantages they have of a secure and loving family.

How intrusive is the assessment process?

The assessment is an important and thorough process which usually takes between 3 and 5 months. We carry out a range of checks on all members of your household. However, your assessing Social Worker is there to guide you through the process and most carers find it an enjoyable experience.
