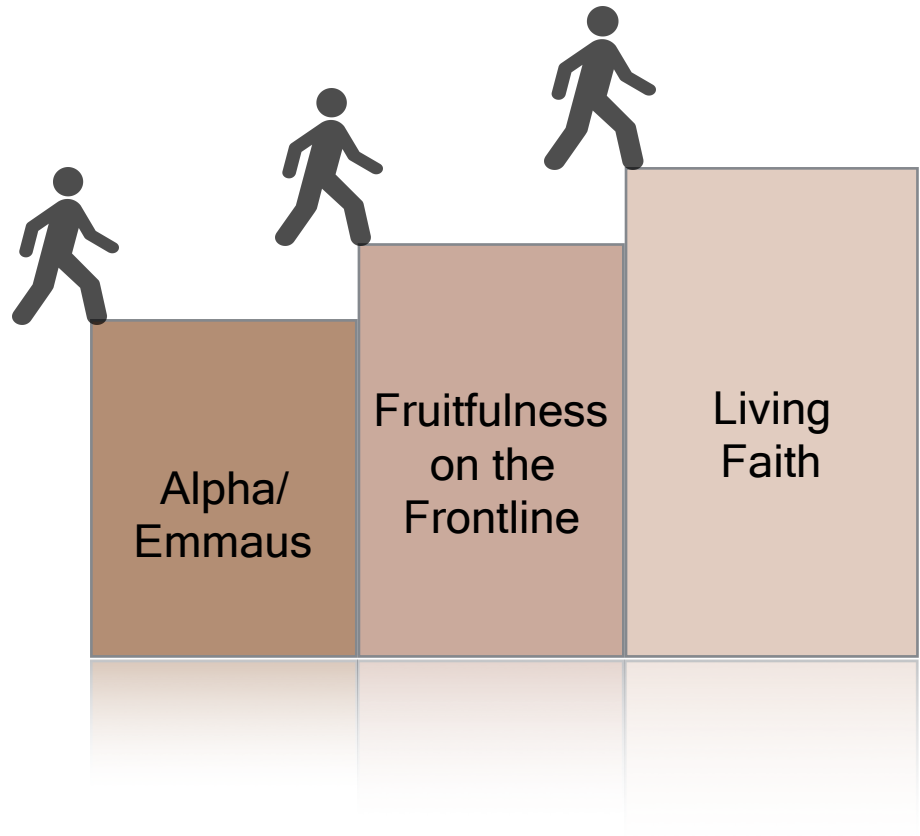


a discipleship course tailored for anyone wishing to learn more about Christianity or ideal preparation for theological and vocational training

## more about the Living Faith modules

Living Faith consists of six modules on the major practices, topics and themes of Christian belief. Each module takes around 10 weeks to complete with a half-term break. The full course comprises three modules per year for two years. Take as many modules as you wish but we encourage you to consider completing them all, beginning with Spirituality and Prayer. Here is a taste of what you can expect from each module:

### Module 1 - Spirituality and Prayer

The first module explores various spiritual traditions and relates them to your practice of prayer in daily life.

### Module 2 - Exploring the Bible - New Testament

Module 2 gives an overview of the formation and theology of the New Testament, and includes a study of the Gospels, Jesus as a teacher, signs of the Kingdom, an introduction to Paul and his first letter to the Corinthians.

### Module 3 - Questions of Faith

Christian doctrine is about what Christians believe about God. This third module looks at what Christians believe and why.

### Module 4 - Mission Shaped Church

This module considers the challenges that face the contemporary church in the light of previous church history.

### Module 5 - Exploring the Bible - Old Testament

The fifth module gives an overview of the formation and theology of the Old Testament, along with specialist themes such as prophecy.

### Module 6 - Challenging Choices - Christian Ethics

Ethics and living a good life in which we are constantly making decisions about right and wrong is a key theme in Christianity. This final unit of the course considers the way in which we make those decisions.

## individual study

A study guide given at the beginning of each module contains work to be completed each week: reading and thinking, writing a sentence or two in a box, looking at pictures, maps etc. You should set aside two to three hours between tutorials to do this. During the tutorials, there will be a discussion of the work done at home. The tutor will also provide additional activities for the group.
