





- But it is essential and will become even more so as the climate crisis continues




Climate Outreach survey 2025

- August 2025 release of survey results
- Three particular stand-outs:
 - We are a nation of nature lovers
 - Trust in society, politics and government is collapsing
 - Climate action has an image problem, but it is fixable
- 74% believe climate change is important, but they think they are in the minority



How important, if at all, do you think climate change is?






Do you think that reaching net-zero will be...

What do good communications look like?

- Clear focused message
- 'Why' – people need meaning before making effort
- Clarity beats impressiveness
- Clear call to action

What do good communications look like?

- Scannable – most comms via email or SM on a phone
 - 60-62% emails on mobile, Southern California News Group
 - 60-65% global website traffic on mobile, Quantumrun.com
 - Short headlines
 - Optimised images
 - Short paragraphs with links to read more
 - Buttons for important links
 - Spacing



What do good communications look like?

- 'Real' language
 - Back up technical or scientific terms with basic explanations
- Clear next steps and expectations
 - Give a vision of 'better'



What do bad communications look like?

- Wall of text
- Using guilt or emotional manipulation
- Data deep-dives
- Vagueness
- Click bait
- One message fits all
- Not checking/proofing

- TRUTH
- HOPE
- NEXT



Doing it well

- **CARE**


- Start with shared values
- “We love our neighbours.”
- “We want to be wise with money.”
- “We want to look after what God has made.”



Doing it well

- **TRUTH**

- Give one or two simple facts
- Avoid fact-dumping
- Use human-scale facts
- Make global relatable
- “How will this affect us?”

Doing it well

- HOPE
 - Show realistic and positive action
 - Not denial but agency
 - “We can do something meaningful together”
 - Eco Church / Climate Stewards
 - *Talking Climate* podcast, Katherine Hayhoe

- **NEXT**

- Make the next step obvious
- “join us”, “reply”, “sign up”,
“come along”,
“do this one thing”




Recommendation

Saving Us

By Katherin Hayhoe

- The most crucial action individuals can take regarding climate change is to discuss it and advocate for solutions within their influence.
- Starting conversations with points of agreement rather than disagreement can lead to surprisingly productive outcomes.
- Speaking up about climate change, even in everyday interactions, is presented as a moral act that prevents dismissive voices from dominating the narrative.
