Pupils get new room for prayer

Portsmouth academy can now make use of a new prayer room.

Charter Academy, in central Portsmouth, is our diocese's only C of E secondary school on the mainland.

And the Archdeacon of Portsdown, the Ven Joanne Grenfell, who is also chair of governors there, officially opened the brand new prayer space at the academy last month.

It is a reflective space where students can ask questions about faith, pray, or speak to someone about an issue that is bothering them.

It features a large wooden cross that was used in St Luke's School, which became Charter Academy in 2009.

The Archdeacon was also joined by Canon Bob White, who is area dean, and the Rev Annie McCabe, who is vicar of the neighbouring St Luke's Church.

The academy's Head of Humanities Grace Duffy said: "The archdeacon also spent time in Year 9 and Year 10 lessons being asked various questions about her faith. The students had a fantastic time and felt honoured
