Encourage and support people in communities to come together to take action for nature and improve (for nature and people) the places that matter to them in ways they feel are important.






How might this look?

 more wildlife friendly areas & small outdoor spaces created, enhanced & supported by the community

- shift in behaviours to reduce pressure on the environment
- 1 in 4 make a change, then we can help to tip the balance back in nature's favour







Places of worship, churches, churchyards, burial grounds & nature

- Refuges for local nature and provide valuable greenspace (approx. 61 has / 151 acres IW)
- Churchyards often remnants of the older landscape (species rich grassland, veteran trees)
- Buildings can support important local species too e.g. bats, swifts, lichens.

- Enhancing local nature and boosting local biodiversity,
 supporting champion species and healthy ecosystems
- Carbon storing, urban cooling, flood mitigation
- Nature connection mental health & physical benefits strengthen community ties & build stronger links.


