OUR STORY

Following an invitation from the Bishop of Portsmouth, Harbour Church was planted out of HTB network church St. Peter's Brighton, in September 2016. We began life in a department store on Commercial Road, the main high street in the centre of the city. A team of 15 people moved from Brighton with a vision to see the church revitalised in Portsmouth, with a specific focus on reaching the 'missing generation' of 15-30 year olds in the city. From the very beginning, we ran the 10am family service, the 6pm students and young adults service, and Alpha. Two years later, we planted our 4pm family service into St Alban's church, now known as our Copnor location. We also moved the 10am service into St George's church (Gunwharf location), whilst continuing to host our 6pm service in Commercial Road. In 2019, we moved our offices and our 6pm service to All Saints church (City location), as we became one church, three locations. Over lockdown we were able to produce a high-quality church online service, with lots of other resources from Harbour Kids, Harbour Youth, Harbour Co. and Harbour Creative. We were also able to join with citywide initiatives tackling loneliness and food poverty, delivering thousands of food parcels, starting Safe Harbour (see LYN page) and increasing our foodbank hours to run every day.

This was a significant time for us, as we were able to prove ourselves as being a gathered resource church who also cared for our local communities. We continued to run Alpha online every term, made sure our Groups continued to meet fortnightly, and ran a fortnightly quiz, which was always well attended! In Easter 2021, we returned to the building running all services and ministries, plus Sundays online. We are currently a regular worshipping community of at least 500 people across our locations. Highlights of our year are always our Christmas and Easter events and services, sending a team to the Leadership Conference, and getting as many people as we can to Focus, where we gather with the rest of the HTB network to worship and go deeper in our relationships with God and each other.

We are for the 99% of people in Portsmouth and beyond who do not go to church. We let our city know that Jesus' message is 'You Belong Here'. We are outward-focused to reach the 99. Our priority will always be to meet our city's needs and shape ministry around reaching people in the city rather than primarily aiming Sundays and other ministries at people who have faith already.

15-30 year-olds

This was Harbour Church's specific invite from the last Bishop of Portsmouth: to reach this lost generation who are not engaging with church. We want to be creative in reaching every demographic, with this particular focus on the 'missing generation' of 15-30 year-olds. We love having people of all other ages in our church family, but we will unapologetically lean into this age group.

MISSION (CONTINUED)

A Resource Church that loves to plant

We are a city centre based resource church for the city and beyond. We have a wide-open front door always in the anticipation that people will go and plant out from here, as they have done to Gosport, Cardiff, Torbay and the Isle of Wight already. When the time and opportunity is right, we give our people away! We are different to a traditional parish church in that we will draw people from a wider area and then plant into local contexts across the city. In this way we are both a gathered and local church community.

Alpha & LYN

We have a policy of continuous termly Alpha so there is never long to wait for someone who comes to a church event, ministry or a Sunday to engage in bringing their questions about the Christian faith. It also shapes our thinking, as a church, into always meeting and inviting people to explore faith, something we do through our 'Love your Neighbour' ministries. We want to be Jesus' hands and feet in our locations and find new ways to serve and meet the needs of local people. We are delighted that we are part of the HTB Network wider family, who also share Alpha, Love your Neighbour and these other mission markers at their core, within the wider families of Portsmouth Diocese and the Church of England. It's great to be part of something bigger.

VALUES

We know that culture happens either by default or design, and we want to be intentional with how we pursue our mission. These values reflect the culture and approach we aspire to see in every member of our team.

POSITIVE

We are solution orientated.

Jesus was positive when he said 'yes' to those who longed to be healed or those thousands who needed to be fed even when initial resources looked low.

FUN

Fun is Fun.

Jesus was fun in how and who he spent time with. Friendship and food were never far away whether with the 3, the 12 or the wider crowd.

BRAVE

Even if it scares us, if it's the right decision, we'll do it.

Jesus was brave when he crossed cultural boundaries to be in relationship with all people, stood up to authorities and in taking the road to the cross.

KIND

We do all things with love as the basis & Jesus at the heart.

Jesus was kind when He welcomed and stood alongside those on the margins and restored those who let him down.

OUR CITY

PORTSMOUTH



The City of Portsmouth is a densely populated island, with a strong naval heritage and university presence. There are currently 28,000 students studying at Portsmouth university, whilst the city itself has a population of about 220,000.



Main attractions include Gunwharf Quays, a popular area for shopping and eating and drinking out, the Historic Dockyard, and the seafront, a four mile stretch of coastline which is great for walking, cycling, sitting on the beach, and swimming or paddle boarding. You can get to London in an hour and a half on the train, and the South Downs and New Forest are an easy car ride away.

Our new Team Vicar (COPNOR)

The Team Vicar (Copnor) will take on a senior role within Harbour Church to ensure we are driving forward our vision to play our part in the evangelisation of the nation, the revitalisation of the church and the transformation of society.

The Team Vicar (Copnor) will have a specific remit to develop a fresh vision for our Copnor location including the growth of a new worshipping community. Building on the existing community of young families, the role will develop relationships with the local community and school to ensure that every person in Copnor knows they are seen, loved and welcome at St Alban's Church. The new service will come with a committed planting team from our Gunwharf location made up of local families with a passion for Copnor and to see people encounter Jesus.

The Team Vicar will also oversee our existing family-based service, The Four, which creates a fun and inviting space for people to explore church and faith in a no-pressure environment. Particularly aimed at younger families, the service is a unique offering amongst our provision at Harbour Church and has the potential to gather community from across the city and beyond.

The Team Vicar will be an active and visible presence out and about in the immediate community of Copnor, building relationships and partnering with local schools, community centres and other services.

As Harbour Church we meet across three different locations in Portsmouth: Gunwharf (St George's), Copnor (St Alban's) and City (All Saints). Each location has a unique identity and is home to services and activities that serve a specific demographic or local need.

COPNOR

Meeting at St. Alban's Copnor in the centre of Portsmouth island amongst the tightly packed Victorian streets full of young families in one of Portsmouth's most affordable areas

The Four:

Our 4pm service is unashamedly tailored towards young families. Families gather together once a month for craft, worship, games and drama. Around 60 adults and 80 children attend the service. We estimate that 75% of this congregation were previously unchurched and most walk to church.

St Alban's has always been centred around community and church growth having been built as part of an initiative to increase the number of churches in the north of Portsmouth following the population boom in the pre-war years. The church once gathered a large Anglo-Catholic congregation which dwindled at the end of the twentieth century, we wish to see this location alive and full of committed worshippers on a regular basis.

The church was also rebuilt after bombing in the Second World War and so a tradition of rebirth is also at the heart of St Albans. Through projects such as The Four and Tots and Toddlers, the church has been reimagined as a place for families to find home and have fun. This is the perfect springboard for the launch of a new worshipping community who are passionate for the local area. The demographic of the local community is predominantly young families with 45% of the parish residents being aged between 0-29 (2018 parish census). Just over 30% of the households are occupied by are single parent families (2021 parish census).

LOCATIONS

CITY

Meeting at All Saints Portsea at the foot of the M275 near the commercial port in one of the most deprived wards in the country

The Harbour Church offices are based here and we operate the ministries of Safe Harbour, Vista & Haven from City part of our 'Love Your Neighbour Social Transformational Hub'.

The 9.30. Our Traditional Eucharist service runs every Sunday with a faithful congregation of between 15-20 people. Committed to local mission this group run a Saturday morning breakfast club and shop as well as regular tea and cake afternoons for the local community.

GUNWHARF

Meeting at St George's Portsea in the shadow of Portsmouth's number one retail, bars, and restaurant location, Gunwharf Quays

The Ten:

A lively morning service with all ages represented starting with fresh coffee and pastries. Harbour Kids groups run for ages 1-11 and Youth groups for school years 6-9. Doors open at 10am for a 10:30am start, with each service providing great worship, talks and the opportunity to be prayed with. Our usual Sunday attendance is 235 with an estimate of 300 adults and 100 children overall who would call The Ten home.

The Six:

Our Harbour Co service is aimed at Students and young adults. Doors open at 6pm for a 6.15pm start. This is where we really lean into the missing generation of 15-30 year olds with great worship, talks and community. Usual Sunday attendance is 110 young adults with an estimate of 160 young adults overall who would call The Six home. The Six is made up of a completely different congregation to The Ten.

As part of our vision at Harbour, we are excited to develop all three locations, and as well as the Team Vicar role for our Copnor location we are also developing our City location and advertising for a Team Vicar role as part of this as we look to serve and love the city of Portsmouth."

LOCATIONS



LOVE YOUR NEIGHBOUR



Our LYN ministries are our main vehicle for playing our part in the transformation of society. As well as SILVA, we currently focus on Safe Harbour and Foodbank.

Safe Harbour

Safe Harbour is our weekly Monday night meal for anyone who needs a hot meal, typically those who are homeless or vulnerable. Each week, a team of committed volunteers cook and serve dinner and dessert to around 50 people. Over the meal, guests find community with each other and with the team. A few guests have since joined our Sunday congregation, and this term, Safe Harbour have their own group on Alpha. Safe Harbour is run from our City location.

Food Bank

We are part of the Trussell Trust group of foodbanks, operating as a satellite of another church in a different part of the city. Foodbank is currently open for an hour a week, and is run entirely by volunteers, who provide emergency food parcels for those with vouchers. Foodbank is run from our Gunwharf location.

SILVA

Silva is a combination of Spa 61, Vista and Haven. Each have a vision to see women empowered and encouraged – to see hope, dignity and love restored to those who need it. We want to play a part in reminding women of their worth and their potential whilst providing an opportunity for community and friendship. Through women coming alongside women, we see the transformational power of simple acts of kindness in someone's life. As a team we are always prepared to 'give an answer to everyone who asks (us) the reason for the hope we have.' We are trained in good listening and how to speak about our relationship with Jesus with 'gentleness and respect.'

Spa 61

At Spa 61 we provide a safe space for women to come and experience community, acceptance and kindness. By transforming a church into a beauty room once a month, or through one of our Pop-Ups at private locations with our partner organisations such as women's refuges, we enable women to take time for restoration and relaxation with free beauty treatments, delicious food and a warm and fun atmosphere. We want women to leave feeling seen, heard and loved with a gift bag in hand to remind them of the experience.

Vista

Vista exists to come alongside women in the sex industry in Portsmouth and the surrounding area. We offer support with safety planning and next steps planning where a woman is seeking change as well as holistic support to any woman affected by sexual exploitation. We come alongside women to offer support in variety of ways:

- *Visits to lap dancing clubs and massage parlours with gift bags and the offer of support/a listening ear*
- *One to one sessions with women who are escorting or working online, providing regular trauma-informed support and advocacy within clearly agreed boundaries.*

We plan to establish our own Spa 61 training salon for women to find alternative employment through accredited training with the support they might need to complete this and access further training and employment in the beauty industry.

Haven

Haven is a partnership between The Medaille Trust Moving on Project, Portsmouth City of Sanctuary, Vista and Spa 61. The group provides opportunities for women, by referral only, who have experienced, or are experiencing exploitation, gender abuse, or women who have had extreme adverse experiences to discover connection with others in a safe, relaxed, private space. We provide a warm welcome, some great refreshments and a range of activities, including beauty treatments, crafts, workshops, discussions and informative sessions.

GROUPS

LIFE IS BETTER TOGETHER

LIFE IS BETTER TOGETHER

Groups are the key way we connect with each other as a church, growing together in faith, life and friendship. Groups consist of gatherings of 10-20 people who meet fortnightly across Portsmouth and beyond to belong, grow and share purpose.

BELONG

Through fun, food and experiencing life together with a smaller group of people who you can get to know well.

GROW

Learning through worship, the Bible and prayer to grow as followers of Jesus, wherever you are in your faith.

PURPOSE

We are excited to see our groups developing shared purpose together as they work to support a local charity, encourage an area of the city or roll up their sleeves to support one of our LYN teams.

Groups have about 170 regular adult attenders with 275 adults allocated to a group. Recent video teaching content has included sessions on sharing faith, Spiritual gifts and looking at the books of James, 1 Peter and Philipians.

MAKE A DIFFERENCE, JOIN A TEAM.

Teams help the church to run and serve the city. Whatever you're interested in, there's a team for you. They're also a great place to have fun and meet new people.

Exists to make Jesus known, serve the church and love the city. Opportunities include worship, stream, production and media.

Generations Team exists to see

every generation, from newborns to 90 year olds, flourish in faith and life. Opportunities include Harbour Kids, Harbour Youth & Harbour Students.

Love Your Neighbour exists to

see the transformation of society. Opportunities include Spa 61, Vista, Safeharbour, CAP and Food Bank.

Home Team exists to use their skills in hospitality and catering to build the home of Harbour Church. Opportunities include Sunday welcome, hospitality and café.

TEAMS



HARBOUR KIDS

At Harbour Kids we have a vision for all children in Portsmouth and beyond to know that they are seen, loved and important to the creator of the universe. We want children to grow up knowing that church is for them, and that it is a space where they can have the best hour of their weeks. We often refer to the children attending Harbour Kids as 'World Changers' because we believe that starting life with a foundation of Jesus' love, they are going to change the world! We recognise that we are playing a part in the bigger vision, and know that if children are happy in church their parents will want to stay involved with church too.

The Ten

We currently run 3 Harbour Kids groups during The Ten for age groups 1-2s, 3-5s and 6-10s. Since September 2022, we have seen our weekly attendance grow to approximately 70 kids with a kids' team of 10-12 people serving each week. At Harbour Kids we know there is no such thing as a junior Holy Spirit and have seen God work in miraculous ways across all age groups. We want to equip parents as they nurture their children towards a life with Jesus. Every month we take on a new theme to explore key messages from the bible. We always want to give our best and recognise everything we do shows the kids that they are seen, loved and important.



Tots and Toddlers

In 2016 we launched our first Tots and Toddlers group at our Copnor Location with 5 mums wanting to meet in the church hall. Over the last 6 years we have seen that grow to 60-70 parents each week and we have found it to be a great bridge towards Sunday services and Alpha. After the success of Copnor Tots and Toddlers, we have a vision to launch groups across all of our locations to engage with the local families in their specific areas.

After we witnessed the community and strong family identity of Copnor, we launched 'The Four' service at our Copnor Location. This is a fresh expression of worship which aims to engage families who wouldn't typically consider coming to church.

Schools and events in the community

We have good connections with St George's Primary School and Copnor Primary School. Through engagement with the local schools, we have been able to put on successful events engaging with families from outside the church. Each year we run a Light Party at our Copnor location and in 2023 had 300 people attended.



HARBOUR YOUTH

Harbour Youth shares our church vision to play our part in the evangelisation of the nation, the revitalisation of the church and the transformation of society. As a youth department we aim to be a ministry that plays an active role in the lives of young people, facilitating environments and conversations that point to Jesus.

Youth Nights

Every Wednesday we have Youth Night. This is a space for our entire youth ministry to gather, to share food, worship together, and have great biblical based content through a talk, group discussions or panels.

Sunday Youth @ The Ten

This is a space tailored for youth in school years 6-9. Full of high-octane fun and discussion based, we believe this is the way that adds most value to the growth of each young person, allowing them space to express themselves, their views, and questions, all the while pointing the conversation back to Jesus.

The Six

Our 6pm service is the space for school years 10-13 on a Sunday. This is a great opportunity for them to worship and hear a great talk as well as build relationships with each other, students and the wider church.



HARBOUR CO

Harbour Co. is our community of 18-30 year olds who want to play their part in the evangelisation of the nation, the revitalisation of the church, and the transformation of society. This consists of our Older Youth, Students, Young Adults, and Bridge the Gap, who all come together as a worshipping community at the 6pm service.

Students

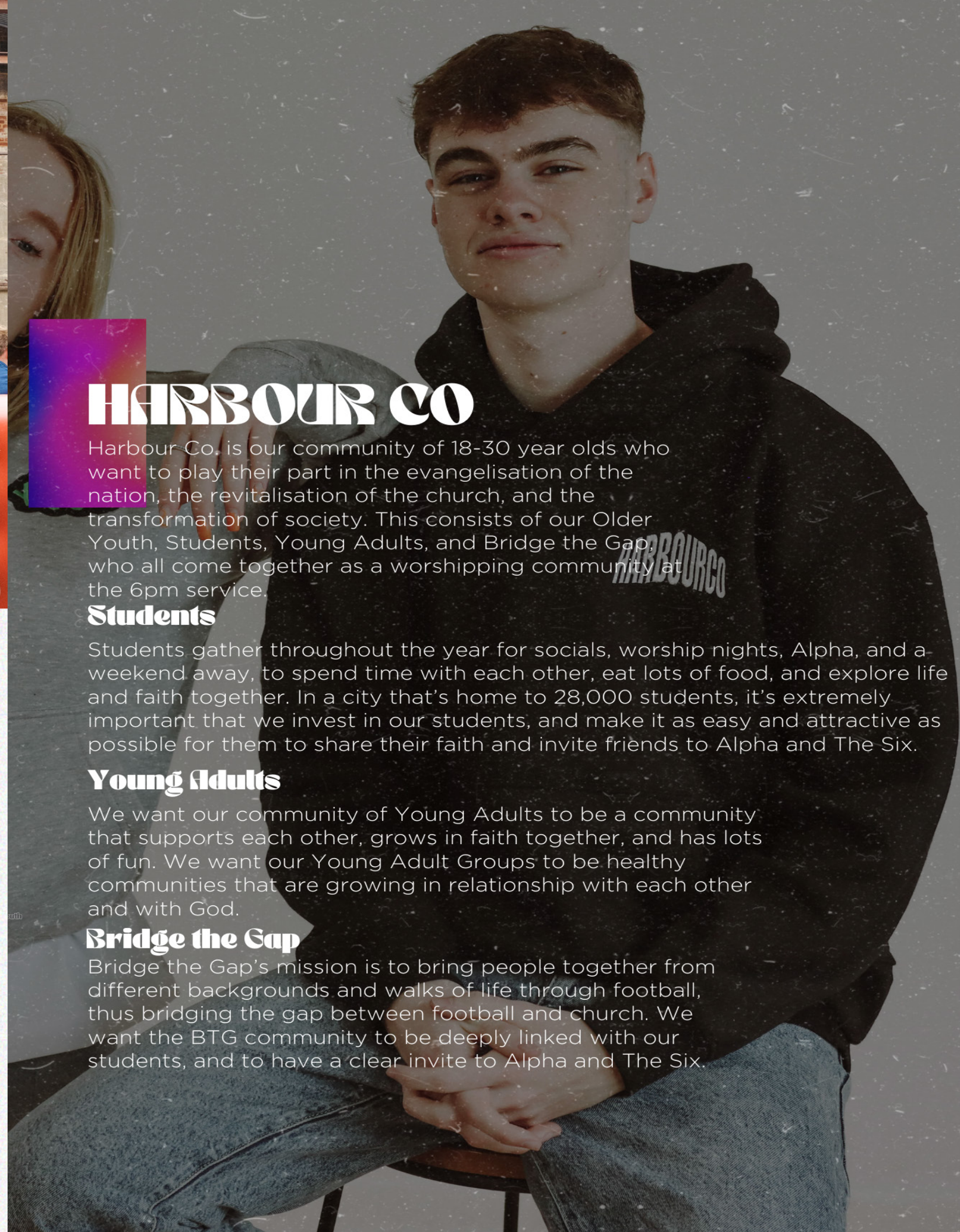

Diocese of Portsmouth

The Diocese of Portsmouth stretches across south-east Hampshire and includes the whole of the Isle of Wight. It includes 139 parishes, from Botley in the west to Emsworth in the east, and from Blackmoor in the north to Ventnor on the south side of the Isle of Wight. It includes diverse communities, ranging from the densely populated and relatively deprived parts of inner-city Portsmouth, to rural villages in Hampshire; and from a range of seaside towns on the Isle of Wight to suburban communities west of Fareham and Gosport. In total, it covers 420 square miles and has a population of 784,000.

Bishop Jonathan Frost was installed in March 2022 and has shared his vision for the diocese – a place where all are invited into a life-enhancing encounter with Jesus Christ. It should be a place where children, young people and young adults are given a particular priority; and where ministry to the elderly is supported by a network of Anna Chaplains, working in every locality. Over the last few years with much prayer, learning from experience, and working together to build relationships and trust, we have developed a Diocesan vision: “the Diocese of Portsmouth longs to be **a rejuvenating community of Jesus-centred, Kingdom-seeking disciples**”.

Our strategy to deliver the vision has Rejuvenation, children and young people, as the intentional focus of everything we do. Our primary strategy to have congregations full of children and young people is to have flourishing churches. Our strategy themes are:

- **Revive:** a call to deeper prayer for all our clergy and lay leadership to experience a continued personal refreshing of the wonder of God’s presence in our life. Key to this, is the establishment of small peer-to-peer “Benedictine style support networks” capable of developing realistic revitalisation plans.
- **Revitalise:** grow our existing churches, connecting ministries together to form a pathway that reaches people who are unconnected with church, and supports them as they journey to become committed disciples who own for themselves Jesus’ mission.
- **Renew:** in communities where there is no effective church presence, we believe it is right to plant/transplant new congregations to focus on outreach and younger generations.

Harbour Church are so grateful for the vision, wisdom, and support of Portsmouth Diocese over the past eight years. The Senior Team has consistently backed Harbour Church from our early days of conception to the appointment of our new Rector in 2023 and beyond. For this we are truly appreciative, and we would love to see our new Team Vicars play their part in the wider life of the Diocese and Portsmouth Deanery encouraging our partnership and place in the Diocese to grow, learning from others and contributing to the conversation.

GOVERNANCE

We are pleased to write that through the help of Portsmouth Diocese and the Church of England the three Portsmouth parishes that Harbour had acquired locations in were joined as one non-contiguous parish from 1 August 2022.

This meant that we moved from a four way governance structure involving Harbour CIO (from the days of our BMO) and three PCCs to just one PCC which was elected in on 27 September 2022.

The make-up of the PCC is:

Our 4 current clergy
2 churchwardens drawn from our Gunwharf location
A deputy warden from our City location
A deputy warden from our Copnor location
6 members from across our locations
A Treasurer
Our Chief Operations Officer (in attendance and non-voting)

There are a range of great people on the PCC with excellent knowledge and hearts across the localities sharing much organisational, church, legal, professional, financial and life experience. The PCC meets every other month throughout the year.

Our City location, at All Saints Portsea, has its own DCC with some delegated powers and meets quarterly.

The day to day running of Harbour Church is provided by the Rector, assisted by other clergy, Ministry Heads & our Chief Operations Officer. Whole staff meets are currently every Tuesday.
